Take Action

- Block some phone numbers, emails, and IP addresses. The ACTIC collects some indicators of compromise that you can use to proactively prevent attacks. And sorry that the attached spreadsheet is not formatted for easy tool consumption. We're currently working on building a cyber threat platform to simplify and streamline IOC sharing.
